12 **Impact Study** - An impact study is in progress to understand the socio economic condition of the project beneficiaries. The study is conducted at present in South 24 Parganas, Jaynagar I & II blocks.

## **Findings:**

- In the present study we found that overall 61 (25.4%), 105 (43.8%), 62 (25.8%) and 12 (5.0%) were belonged to general caste, scheduled caste, others backward classes A and others backward classes B category respectively.
- Overall 178 (74.2%) and 62 (25.8%) were belonged to Hindu and Muslim religious groups.
- Most of the borrowers were literate, overall literacy rate was 96.7% and only 3.3% was illiterate. In literate group most the participant belonged to upper primary level, (i.e class V- VIII) the rate was 61.7%.
- Purpose of loan business, home construction, daughter marriage, education, agriculture, poultry farm, auto business and medical related were 82.5%, 11.25, 2.1%, 1.2%, 0.8%, 0.8% 0.8% and 0.4% respectively.
- In the present study we found that any financial decision were taken by own (borrowers) 4.2%, husband 39.6%, both (husband & wife) 52.1 and all family members 4.2%.

The study is in progress, as of now on the basis of the data collected from the district states that the weaker section of region is in need of economy support from money lending institutions to meet their financial arrangements. Microfinance institutions are playing crucial role to help them meet their needs. They are focus to improve their standard of living which leads economic growth. Very Specifically, it promotes women's empowerment, which is a significant step in the growth of the nation.
